Support Center for Advocacy, Response, and Education To Broaden Its Outreach Among Graduate Students

NOTING, Purdue Center for Advocacy, Response, and Education (CARE) provides free and confidential support to students who have experienced interpersonal violence (e.g., sexual violence, harassment, stalking); and

NOTING, CARE offers free campus-wide prevention workshops, topics including bystander intervention, survivor support, and identifying interpersonal violence. CARE's service is valuable to the graduate community as 41% of graduate students are international students and may experience cultural differences when it comes to identifying power-based violence within relationships; and

NOTING, Graduate students, international students especially, may be experiencing domestic violence or aggression and receive limited support, or do not discuss these issues with others due to concerns related to academic standing, immigration status and many more; and

NOTING, CARE's service is less known by the graduate student community. Graduate students who experience interpersonal violence do not know they can turn to CARE for support, thus further education and awareness regarding interpersonal violence must be made a priority to better the graduate student experience; and

NOTING, GSOs have fewer incentives to organize workshops with CARE, presumably because graduate students may not have time to participate in workshops outside breaks or evenings; and

NOTING, Current PGSG grants do not cover the initiatives of CARE, and due to a lack of awareness, GSOs would not think of CARE when applying for PGSG grants.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED, The PGSG contributes \$1000 to CARE by the end of Spring 2023 for the use of initiatives towards the graduate student body.
