WHEREAS, Purdue University's value statement reads, "We are a unified community that respects each other by embracing diversity..." and Purdue considers diversity as one of its six pillars; and

WHEREAS, The United States recognizes National Arab American Heritage Month as the month of April;¹ and

WHEREAS, The term Arab and Middle Eastern were used previously, has been replaced with Southwest Asian and North African (SWANA), as previously defined in resolution FA22-R009 to be more inclusive of cultures, religions, and ethnic groups unique to the region; and

WHEREAS, As indicated in Exhibit "A," several universities recognize SWANA Heritage Month in April.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED, That PGSG recognizes April as the SWANA heritage month starting from April 2023.
